

## Broadleaf Evergreen Shrubs

### *Arctostaphylos uva-ursi* – Bearberry – Z3

Bearberry is a wonderful, low growing evergreen groundcover native throughout much of North America. The foliage is lustrous dark green in summer and turns rich, reddish-bronze in fall and winter. In late summer and fall, plants are cloaked with an exceptional display of bright red, pea-sized fruit. Plants perform best in acidic sandy soils in full sun or partial shade. They also exhibit tremendous salt tolerance. Grows 6-12" tall with a 2-4' spread. – **1 gallon \$15; 2 gallon \$25 (summer)**

### *Buxus sempervirens* – Common Boxwood – Z5

An excellent, deer resistant, evergreen landscape plant used extensively in Europe and some parts of the United States. The slow growing plants respond well to pruning and are excellent for hedging or as an accent plant in both formal and informal plantings. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Elegantissima'** - A slow growing selection with cream-white variegated foliage. Appears to have good hardiness as our landscape specimen has withstood temperatures below zero with little if any leaf discoloration. Will reach 5' by 5' in many years. - **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$49 (summer)**

**'Graham Blandy'** – A striking, columnar form introduced by the Blandy Experimental Farm in Virginia. Excellent vertical accent plant. Mature plants may be 9' tall and only 12-15" wide. – **3 gal \$49; 5 gal \$69 (summer)**

**'Tide Hill'** – A charming, dwarf, spreading boxwood that grows to only 1' in height but spreads 4-5' wide over a 20 year period. Makes a choice, tight hedge and is noted for holding its winter color as well as any other form. – **2 gal \$35**

**NEW** **'Variegata'** – A prized clone that closely resembles the selection 'Elegantissima'. Plants offer similar foliage coloration and landscape durability. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

### *Buxus sinica var. insularis* – Korean Boxwood – Z5

A broad-rounded boxwood with fresh green, rosemary-like foliage packed along dense shrubby stems. As cool weather sets in the leaves take on faint plum and bronze hues. Overall an especially versatile and handsome form of boxwood. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Justin Brouwer'** - A diminutive selection of Korean boxwood valued for its slow growth rate and pointed emerald-green leaves. Plants make an ideal candidate for small hedges or for evergreen accent at the front of the border. Ten year old plants average 15" tall with the ultimate size approaching 3' high and wide. - **1 gal \$25; 2 gal \$35 (summer)**

### *Buxus* Hybrids – Hybrid Boxwood – Z5

A group of hybrid boxwoods with a mix of *Buxus sempervirens* and *B. microphylla* in their parentage.

**'Golden Dream' PP 16053** - A striking addition to the world of boxwood. Each leaf is emargined with a uniform gold edge that makes plants stand out like a beacon in the garden. Plants are average growers forming tidy, rounded mounds that make excellent garden accents. - **2 gal \$39 (summer)**

**'Green Mountain'** - A popular *Buxus microphylla v. koreana* x *B. sempervirens* hybrid that develops an upright pyramidal habit. Foliage is dark green and holds its coloration well in cold weather. Matures 5' tall and 3' wide. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45; 5 gal \$65 (summer); 18-24" B+B \$79**

**'Green Velvet'** – A hybrid that resulted from a cross between *Buxus microphylla* and *B. sempervirens*. Offers a shapely, low-mounding habit and fine-textured leaves that maintain their dark green color throughout the winter. Matures 3-4' high and wide. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer)**

### *Ilex crenata* – Japanese Holly – Z5

A highly functional, rounded evergreen shrub used frequently by landscape professionals. Plants are easy going, performing best in well-drained soils in full sun or part shade. Makes an excellent companion plant or back-drop for showier specimens.

**'Beehive'** – A highly functional, rounded evergreen shrub forming a dense, compact, mounding plant with tiny glossy green leaves. Selected by Dr. Elwin Orton of Rutgers University. Slowly growing to 3-4' in height. - **2 gal \$29; 3 gal \$39 (summer)**

**NEW** **'Drops of Gold' PP 14420** – A broad spreading, gold foliage Japanese holly forming a larger specimen than many other golden forms. The versatile plants strut bright gold, scald resistant foliage in sunny locales. In shaded sites the leaves maintain an equally attractive yet subtle lime-green coloration. Excellent for use in the mixed border and valued for winter interest. 3' high by 5' wide. - **2 gal \$35**

**'Dwarf Pagoda'** – A choice, oddball holly for the plant geeks of the world. Introduced by Dr. Elwin Orton of Rutgers University, 'Dwarf Pagoda' is an incredibly slow growing holly with the coolest tiny green leaves and congested growth. Plants muster up to an inch of growth a year forming a first class natural bonsai in time. Certainly a choice treasure for the rock garden or tiny garden nook. - **2 gal \$45 (summer)**

**'Golden Gem'** – A low, spreading cultivar with vivid golden-yellow leaves. Makes an excellent contrast element but best reserved for zone 6 and warmer. - **3 gal \$39**

**'Ivory Tower WB'** – A tight, irregular mounding shrub with minute, creamy-white edged and spotted leaves. The slow growers produce an abundance of white berries which are camouflaged amongst the congested growth in autumn. Plants are hard to find but a must for the rock garden or tight space. 2' x 2' in 20 years. - **2 gal \$45 (summer)**

**'Jersey Pinnacle'** – A dense, compact holly with glossy dark green leaves that remain attractive all year. Makes an excellent choice for hedging or for use in foundation and other garden plantings. 6' - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Sky Pencil'** – A unique, fastigate selection discovered on Mount Daisen in the wilds of Honshu, Japan. Matures 10' tall and only 2' wide at maturity. An excellent choice where a vertical accent is needed. May be slightly less cold hardy than the species. - **2 gal \$29; 5 gal \$59 (summer)**

**'Variegata'** – A vigorous selection offering bright yellow-spotted and splashed leaves. Has proven hardier and more resistant to winter leaf discoloration than other selections in our trial gardens. - **2 gal \$29; 3 gal \$39 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

***Ilex glabra*** – Inkberry Holly – Z4

A rounded evergreen shrub frequently encountered in acidic wetlands throughout eastern North America. Leaves are lustrous dark green and retain their color well in the winter. Plants are amazingly adaptable and are suited for numerous landscape applications. 6-8'

**NEW** **'Gold Mine' PP 14233** – Watch out inkberry fans, a new clone is in town. After a few years of building up stock we're finally able to offer a few of this most unique cultivar. Plants showcase showy gold-edged leaves that remain attractive throughout the growing season

and winter months. Quite a bit different than the straight species yet as adaptable and versatile. Discovered as a sport on the classic cultivar 'Shamrock' by Maryland's Gabe Cesarini. - **2 gal \$35 (summer)**

**'Shamrock'** – A compact, rounded form with lustrous dark green leaves and good leaf spot resistance. Makes a handsome foundation plant or evergreen hedge. - **2 gal \$29; 3 gal \$39; 24-30" B+B \$89; 30-36" \$109**

***Ilex opaca*** – American Holly – Z5

An attractive, slow growing evergreen tree reaching 30' at maturity. Native to shaded woodlands throughout much of the eastern United States. Many female selections offer a wonderful fruit display when grown in close proximity to a male pollinator.

**(Female Select)** – A female clone from Summer Hill Nursery showcasing a wealth of red fruit and excellent, pest and disease free foliage. They claim its one of the finest forms they've seen. - **3 gal \$45; 5 gal \$59 (summer)**

**'Jersey Princess'** – A female form with glossy green leaves and striking crops of cherry-red fruit. Foliage remains attractive throughout the year holding its color in the winter. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

***Ilex pedunculosa*** – Longstalk Holly – Z5

A unique, underutilized species of holly that develops into an attractive, 15-20' evergreen tree. Female plants bare colorful bright red, berry-like fruit on 1-2" pedicles. The evergreen foliage is lustrous dark green and quite un-holly like, resembling mountain laurel, *Kalmia latifolia* or benjamin fig, *Ficus benjamina*. Both male and female plants are required for fruit production. - **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer); 5 gal \$59 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Variegata'** – A cool form of longstalk holly that we've been playing around with for a few years now. Foliage is irregularly streaked and splashed with creamy-white. Definitely not going to make the cover of Martha Stewart Living but certainly about as rare as it gets for those looking for something different. - **2 gal \$39 (summer); 3 gal \$49; 5 gal \$69 (summer)**

***Ilex x attenuata*** – Foster's Hybrid Holly – Z6

A group of hybrid hollies resulting from crosses between *Ilex cassine* and *I. opaca*. They make wonderful, dense 20-30' evergreen trees and are used frequently in the south.

**‘Foster #2’** – A narrow, conical female selection that produces masses of bright red, pea-sized berries. Makes a shapely screen or can be sheered into a manicured hedge. Also a suitable choice for use as a specimen if an upright conical form is desired. – **5 gal \$49; 7 gal \$69 (summer)**

**‘Foster #4’** – A male pollinator for ‘Foster #2’ and ‘Sunny Foster’. Plants are vigorous growers with attractive dark, olive green foliage. – **5 gal \$49; 7 gal \$69 (summer)**

***Ilex x meserveae*** – Meserve Hybrid Holly – Z5  
An indispensable group of hybrid hollies resulting from crosses made between *Ilex rugosa* and *I. aquifolium*. Plants display pest-free, lustrous, bluish-cast, evergreen foliage along sturdy stems. All respond nicely to moderate pruning and can easily be maintained in many shapes and sizes. Both male and female plants are required for fruit production. 10-15’

**‘Blue Maid’** – A hardy and vigorous female cultivar that develops into a broad 15’ shrub. Plants showcase an impressive bright red fruit display. 10-12’ – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**‘Blue Prince’** – A male selection with leathery, dark green leaves and a broad, dense habit. 10’ – **2 gal \$29; 3 gal \$39 (summer); 5 gal \$59 (summer); 30-36” B+B \$89; 3-4’ B+B \$109; 4-5’ B+B \$129; 5-6’ B+B \$149; 6-7’ B+B \$189**

**‘Blue Princess’** – The classic female selection offering excellent blue-green foliage and brilliant, dark red fruit. – **2 gal \$29; 3 gal \$39 (summer); 5 gal \$59 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**‘Dragon Lady’** – An upright conical holly with exquisite lustrous dark green leaves that complement the abundant crops of large red berries. The handsome plants are vigorous and develop a formal 15’ tall x 6’ wide form if left to their own devices. That said, plants are quite amenable to pruning and can be sculpted into a beautiful hedge or maintained in a foundation planting if desired. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45; 5 gal \$69 (summer)**

**NEW** **‘Emerald Magic’ PP 12314** – A choice, densely branched evergreen forming a rounded shrub to 4’ in height. Plants are much more compact than typical blue holly and maintain the deep greenish-blue foliage we’ve come to associate with them. Excellent for foundation plantings or could be sculpted into a low hedge. – **3 gal \$45**

**‘Heckenfee’ Castle Spire™ PP 14310**

– A recent female selection from Germany. Plants are reported to develop a compact-pyramidal form and superior bright red berry display. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**‘Heckenstar’ Castle Wall™ PP 14308**

– A broad-columnar, male selection with lustrous dark green leaves and improved compact branch structure. Reported to be a suitable pollinator for Castle Spire™. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**‘Honey Maid’ PP 12060** – A striking variegated cultivar with blue-gray leaves splashed with cream and yellow highlights. An attractive and versatile addition to this highly regarded group of plants. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer); 5 gal \$69 (summer)**

***Ilex x ‘Serendipity’*** - Serendipity Hybrid Holly - Z6

A cute, extremely slow growing holly that makes a wonderful addition to the rock garden. Exceptional dark-green, thumb-sized foliage on a 1-2’ high and wide specimen. Choice and unique! - **2 gal \$45 (summer)**

***Kalmia latifolia*** – Mountain Laurel – Z5

This exceptional state flower of both Connecticut and Pennsylvania is frequently referred to as one of the most beautiful of all flowering plants. Native throughout eastern North America, they are commonly found growing along roadways and power lines or in shaded, acidic woodlands. Wild plants typically showcase an eye-catching display of pale pink flowers in late May and early June. Added interest is provided by their beautiful glossy dark green foliage. In the landscape plants grow best in full sun or partial shade in moist, well-drained, acidic soil.

We tend to be a bit biased concerning this outstanding shrub, but with good reason. We currently hold the largest collection of mountain laurel in the world and have actively collected and bred the species for many years. The result is a startling range of flower colors and plant habits and more than 30 cultivar introductions with several more on the way.

**'Bay State'** – A red to salmon pink flowered selection that develops an excellent floral display from a young age. Dense plants have thick, lustrous, dark green foliage that is leaf spot resistant. - **18-24" B+B \$59; 24-30" B+B \$75; 30-36" B+B \$95**

**\*'Carol'** – Bright, intense red buds contrast well with the near white, newly opened corollas. Open flowers darken to pink as they age. The low growers have broad, leaf spot resistant foliage. - **18-24" B+B \$59; 24-30" B+B \$75; 30-36" B+B \$95**

**\*'Elf'** - A slow growing little leaf laurel developing into a small stature plant with considerable charm and grace. Flowers are similar to the wild type with light pink buds that open near white. The original cross was made in 1976 by caging six miniature laurels with a bumblebee. **18-24" B+B \$65; 24-30" B+B \$85**

**\*'Freckles'** – An older, compact-spreading selection with white flowers each marked with 10 purplish-cinnamon "freckles". Plants show medium leaf spot resistance and flower nicely from a young age. - **18-24" B+B \$59; 24-30" B+B \$75; 30-36" B+B \$95**

**\*'Galaxy'** – A unique, near-petaled selection that resulted from a cross made in 1984. The star-like, flowers open wide and display burgundy along the inner segments and white along the edge. Plants are vigorous, upright growers with glossy, flat foliage. - **18-24" B+B \$59**

**\*'Keepsake'** - A recent introduction that is the result of five generations of controlled crosses begun in 1966. Plants display striking raspberry-red flower buds that open to near-solid purplish burgundy flowers with a fine white edge. Flowers are backed by pest free, glossy, bluish-green leaves. **18-24" B+B \$59; 24-30" B+B \$75**

**\*'Little Linda'** – The latest addition to the miniature (little leaf) laurel group. It is the first named mountain laurel to combine miniature habit with red-budded flowers. The buds open to display white corollas which age to pink. Foliage is reduced in size, dark glossy green and leaf spot resistant. Plants display a compact-rounded growth habit. – **18-24" B+B \$65; 24-30" B+B \$85**

**'Madeline'** – The only true, fully double-flowered cultivar of *K. latifolia* available. Displays deep rose-pink buds that open to showcase two overlapping near white corollas with speckles. The original plant was raised in New Zealand in the garden of Mrs. E.M. Finch. Amazing to think that such a rare mountain

**\*'Meteor'** – A unique, recent introduction with pink, star-shaped flowers. Plants are moderate growers with light green foliage. **24-30" B+B \$75**

**'Nathan Hale'** – An attractive cultivar selected by the Nathan Hale Society of the Sons of the American Revolution to honor Connecticut's Revolutionary War hero, Nathan Hale. Plants have a symmetrical and compact habit and perform well in the garden. Their dense, dark green leaves are disease free and provide a wonderful backdrop for the red buds and white flowers. – **18-24" B+B \$59; 24-30" B+B \$75**

**\*'Peppermint'** – The blush-pink flower buds open to display striking near-white flowers with a unique maroon-red pattern that resembles a peppermint candy. Winner of the Ames Award at the 1991 Boston Flower Show. - **18-24" B+B \$59; 24-30" B+B \$75; 30-36" B+B \$95**

**\*'Sarah'** – An eye-catching selection with dark red buds that open vibrant pink-red. Our exceptional 8' specimen plant always impresses visitors when in flower. The foliage is dark green and free from disease when grown in the open with some air circulation. Plants are always in high demand! – **18-24" B+B \$59; 24-30" B+B \$75**

**\*'Tiddlywinks'** – A miniature laurel with medium to strong pink buds that open to display soft pink corollas. Color intensity varies from year to year and in different exposures. Plants have good branch structure and develop a broad, compact habit. – **18-24" B+B \$65; 24-30" B+B \$85; 30-36" B+B \$105**

**\*'Tinkerbelle'** – A miniature laurel with heavy textured flowers that are deep pink in bud and medium pink in flower. Foliage is dark green and resistant to leaf spot. Plants show good vigor and will mature somewhat broader than tall. – **18-24" B+B \$65; 24-30" B+B \$85; 30-36" B+B \$105**

**(Wild Type)** – Seedling grown plants that closely resemble those found in wild populations. Flowers are a mix of pale pink and white. – **18-24" B+B \$45; 24-30" B+B \$65; 30-36" B+B \$85; 3-4' B+B \$105**

**NEW** **'Willowcrest'** – A rare treasure with unusual, elongated, strap-like foliage resembling a willow more than a mountain laurel. Adds a completely different texture to the world of *Kalmia* making it an impressive element for contrast and garden presence. Pale pink to white

flowers complement the foliage in early June. -

*Leucothoe fontanesiana* – Drooping Leucothoe  
– Z5

An attractive broadleaf evergreen shrub very closely related to *Leucothoe axillaris*. Plants assume a graceful, arching habit 3-6' in height. Foliage is lustrous dark green during the growing season and often takes on a bronze-purple cast during cooler weather. Plants grow best in moist, acid soils in a shaded site.

**'Compacta'** – A smaller growing form with beautiful glossy foliage in spring. Leaves turn bright burgundy in winter. 3-4' – **2 gal \$29**

**'Lovita'** – A wonderful compact form with rich maroon foliage in winter. 'Lovita' matures into a smaller form than other cultivars of leucothoe and offers rounded, more diminutive foliage. - **2 gal \$29 (summer)**

**'Silver Run'** – An exceptional variegated form with leaves that are a stunning mixture of white, pink and green. A great choice to brighten a shady corner. – **2 gal \$29**

**'Zebid' Scarletta® PP 5195** – A compact selection with bright, red-maroon new growth. Winter leaf coloration is generally deep maroon, especially when exposed to some sun. One of the best! – **2 gal \$29 (summer)**

*Mahonia bealei* – Leatherleaf Mahonia – Z6

A coarse textured, evergreen shrub developing into an irregular mound of thick, spiny margined bluish-gray foliage. Individual leaves are up to 1' long giving a unique tropical appearance. In spring, plants are cloaked with large panicles of fragrant, golden yellow flowers which mature into crops of grape-sized, blue fruit. In our region plants perform best in an acidic, shaded location that is protected from desiccating winter winds. 5-8' - **3 gal \$39; 5 gal \$59 (summer)**

*Osmanthus heterophyllus* – Holly Osmanthus – Z6

A dense, oval evergreen shrub developing a medium stature to 6-8' in height. The deep green leaves are attractive year round and resemble a holly (*Ilex* sp.) at first glance. In our region best growth occurs in a fertile, well-drained location that is protected from exposure and direct sun.

**'Goshiki'** - The foliage of this cultivar is brilliantly blotched and streaked with golden-yellow variegation. Plants are slow growing and make unique specimen shrubs or hedging plants. Best when sited in a location that is protected

from desiccating winter winds. 8-10' – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer)**

**NEW** **'Ogon'** – A rare selection of holly osmanthus sporting flashy golden-yellow foliage. The slow growing plants develop a broad-spreading habit reaching 3' high and 5-6' wide over many years. Plants perform best in a bright shady location that provides protection from desiccating winds and scalding sun. - **2 gal \$45 (summer)**

**'Ron's Variegated'** – Another variegated form of holly osmanthus with deep green foliage that is heavily splashed and speckled with white variegation! New and unique among the cultivars of this fine species. - **3 gal \$45; 5 gal \$69 (summer)**

*Pachysandra procumbens* – Alleghany Pachysandra – Z4

A choice, native groundcover closely related to the more frequently planted *Pachysandra terminalis*. The handsome, bluish-green foliage is often mottled with white-gray markings and generally remains evergreen throughout the winter months. In early spring, a spattering of fragrant, 3-4", creamy-white flower spikes make an attractive display. Overall, a superior groundcover for rich, shaded locations. – **4 pt \$10**

*Pieris japonica* – Japanese Pieris – Z5

A highly variable, broadleaf evergreen shrub closely related to our native *Pieris floribunda*. In March and April plants drip with elegant, drooping panicles of bell-shaped flowers that range in color from snow-white to dark rose-red. Plants perform admirably in moist, acidic, well-drained locations and benefit from some high canopy shade. Additionally, all show excellent resistance to deer browse!

**NEW** **'Bisbee's Dwarf'** – A decidedly compact clone boasting diminutive foliage on a dense, rounded branch framework. The tightly spaced, rich green leaves play backdrop for spring's delicate display of dainty, arching flower panicles. Plants are quite slow growing but will eventually form mounding shrubs to 2-3'. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Brouwer's Beauty'** – A hybrid between *Pieris japonica* and *P. floribunda* but listed here for ease of classification. Develops abundant, slightly drooping, white flowers set off by glossy, dark green foliage. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer); 5 gal \$69**

**'Cavatine'** – A dense, slow-growing selection with dark green foliage and small white

flower clusters. Exhibits exceptional cold hardiness. - **2 gal \$35; Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Dorothy Wycoff'** – A classic form offering striking dark maroon flower buds that open to whitish-pink flowers. Attractive, dark green foliage. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer); 5 gal \$69**

**'Little Heath'** – A delightful, slow-growing cultivar with unique, cream-edged foliage. One of our favorites! 3-4' high and wide. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Pygmaea'** – An out of this world pieris forming an irregular, 3-4' evergreen shrub in time. The delicate, 1" lacy leaves are unlike typical pieris and add a charming fine texture to the garden. White, urn-shaped flowers born in lax panicles provide added interest. – **1 gal \$25; 2 gal \$35**

**'Valley Valentine'** – An upright growing selection with rich maroon flower buds that open to display dark pink bell-shaped flowers. 6-8' – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer)**

***Rhododendron maximum*** – Rosebay Rhododendron – Z5

A large evergreen shrub native to eastern North America. Develops small trusses of soft pink to pale lavender flowers in mid-June. Flowers are complemented by huge, 10-12" oval leaves that provide unique interest throughout the year. Plants frequently reach 15-20' in height in the wild but will likely mature 10-12' in height under cultivation. An excellent screening plant for shaded locations. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**NEW** **'Compacta'** – A compact clone of rosebay showcasing a late spring display of lavender-pink trusses backed by deep green foliage. An excellent option for those who like the look of the species but can't afford the space. 5' - **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer)**

**NEW** **'Roseum'** – A fine selection boasting showy, deep pink flower clusters. Foliage and growth form are similar to the straight species. - **10 gal \$169; Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

***Rhododendron yakushimanum*** – Yaku Rhododendron – Z5

A dense, mounded evergreen rhododendron used frequently as a breeding parent. As a result numerous exceptional hybrids have been made using its highly desirable genetic traits.

**'Ken Janeck'** – Z4 - A great selection honored with the American Rhododendron Society's Award of Excellence. Offers rich pink flower buds that open to large, pink-flushed flowers that fade slowly to white. The dark green leaves are heavily indumented and emerge silver-gray in spring. Plants show excellent hardiness and mature 3-4' in height. – **2 gal \$35; Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

***Rhododendron Hybrids*** –

**NEW** **'Calsap'** – Z5 – An especially attractive cultivar that has always held a prominent spot on our list of favorites. The well formed trusses sport showy white flowers each highlighted with a wine-purple flare. Plants are vigorous and tend to be somewhat upright when mature. 6' - **5 gal \$69**

**NEW** **'Capistrano'** – Z5 – A floriferous hybrid showcasing ample pale yellow flowers set off by deep green foliage. Plants have a round-spreading habit and are excellent for use on the foundation or in the shaded border. 5' - **3 gal \$45**

**'Chionoides'** – Z6 – A *R. ponticum* hybrid noted for its excellent, broad-dense habit. Clean, narrow, dark green leaves provide the perfect backdrop for trusses of bright white flowers with yellow centers in late May. 5' – **5 gal \$69**

**'Cunningham's White'** – Z5 – A reliable grower noted for its exceptional, unblemished foliage and pink-blushed buds that open to display clear-white flowers marked with a greenish-yellow blotch. **'Dorothy Swift'** – Z5 - A slow growing, compact selection. In spring, plants display numerous pale pink flower buds that open to large white flowers. **'Jenny Tabol'** - Z6 - A delightful, compact rhododendron showcasing light yellow flowers highlighted with pink accents. Blossoms appear in mid-May amongst the medium green, long pointed leaves. 4-5' – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45**

**'Lorna'** - Z5 - A double, hose-in-hose azalea with deep purple-pink, funnel-shaped flowers. The evergreen leaves are approximately 2" long with an attractive light green coloration. Plants are compact growers, forming a tidy mounded habit. - **2 gal \$35**

**NEW** **'March Madness'** – Z5 - A 1998 introduction from the University of Connecticut showcasing an early display of lavender-purple blossoms against medium green leaves. An excellent plant to begin the rhododendron bloom season. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Olga Mezitt'** - Z4 - A small-leaved, evergreen rhododendron with bright green summer foliage that takes on a rich, mahogany-bronze color in winter. Small trusses of bright-pink flowers are produced in profusion in early to mid-May. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**NEW** **'Percy Wiseman'** – Z5 - A fine selection showcasing creamy-white, funnel-shaped flowers each flushed with pastel, peachy-pink overtones. Flowers are held in rounded trusses that stand out well from the leathery, green foliage. - **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer)**

**'Pioneer Silvery Pink'** – Z6 – This Hoogendoorn Nurseries introduction makes a stunning addition to the early spring garden. Valued for the profusion of clear, soft-pink

flowers that cover the upright plants in early May, usually escaping late frosts. – **3 gal \$45**

**'PJM Hybrids'** – Z4 - A classic group of rhododendron hybrids that are the result of crosses between *Rhododendron carolinianum* and a select form of *R. dauricum* var. *sempervirens*. The original hybrids were made by Ed Mezitt of Weston Nurseries in the late 1930's. Plants are upright with rounded leaves that take on purplish tones in cool weather. Flowers are lavender-purple and are present in the early spring garden. 6-8' - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**NEW** **'Rangoon'** – Z6 – One of the finest deep red rhododendrons available. The broad, rounded plants are consistently spectacular with their blood red buds and deep red flowers set off by glossy, medium green foliage. - **3 gal \$45**

**'Roseum Elegans'** – Z4 - 'Roseum Elegans' is a classic and durable cultivar with excellent cold hardiness and a consistent, lavender-pink floral display. Plants are vigorous and large growing forming 10' specimens over time. - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**'Solidarity'** – Z6 – An exceptional selection made by the late Hank Schannen of Rare Find Nursery. Plants display large frilly flowers that emerge dark pink and age to white. Large, evergreen leaves are deep green and heavy textured on a compact, spreading plant. One of our favorites! 4-5' high and wide. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$45 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

**Skimmia japonica** – Japanese Skimmia – Z6  
A versatile, low-growing evergreen sub-shrub best utilized in the shade garden. Shimmering, dark green oblong leaves cloak the dense spreading plants. Females produce crops of bright, cherry-red berries held in tight clumps above the foliage. Males are equally attractive offering an abundance of pinkish-red flower buds that open in early spring and emit a sweet fragrance. A versatile plant and certainly one of the finer evergreen groundcovers available. Only male forms will be available this season. - **2 gal \$35**

**Skimmia reevesiana** – Reeves Skimmia – Z6  
This low, spreading, broadleaf evergreen shrub makes a unique addition to that warm corner of the garden. The dark green foliage provides a wonderful contrast to the fragrant, self-fertile white flowers and brilliant dark red fruit. In many seasons the fruit display remains prominent well into the winter months. Prefers

rich, moist, acid soils and benefits from some protection from drying winter winds. Plants are hardier than their close relative, *Skimmia japonica*. 2-3' – **2 gal \$35**
