

Conifers

Abies balsamea – Balsam Fir – Z3

Balsam fir is a medium-sized tree reaching 45-65' tall with a narrow, cathedral-like form. The shiny, dark green needles are attractive year round and emit a classic Christmas fragrance. Plants transplant readily and perform best in areas cooler than zone 6. Best growth occurs in well-drained, evenly moist soil.

NEW 'Bruce's Variegated' – A rare selection of balsam fir showcasing deep green needles irregularly splashed with cream-white variegation. Form and rate of growth are similar to the species with plants averaging 6" of height each season. - 2 gal \$45 (summer)

'Nana' - A fine dwarf conifer developing into a handsome, flat-topped shrub. Offers robust, dark green needles and excellent hardiness. Plants are easily integrated into the rock garden or front of the border. 3' - 2 gal \$39

'Piccolo' – A choice dwarf, dome-shaped form with impeccable deep green needles tightly spaced along congested branching. Each needle is highlighted with a white stomatal stripe and the branches are tipped with prominent russet-bronze buds. 2' - 3 gal \$69; 5 gal \$99 (summer)

'Weeping Larry' – An arching, slow growing form of balsam fir that resembles a weeping Norway spruce at first glance. Deep green needles and interesting branch architecture make it an excellent accent for the rock garden or conifer border. I've got one in my garden, just wish I knew who Larry was! 8-10' - 2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)

Abies concolor – White Fir – Z3

A well known and adaptable fir suitable for many landscape uses. The soft, attractive needles are 1-2" long and vary from blue-green to silver-gray in color. When crushed they give off a distinct citrus odor. Plants develop an upright-conical habit and will mature 30-50' in height. The species has an exceptionally large native range that sprawls throughout western North America from Idaho to the Baja Peninsula. Some of the most spectacular specimens can be seen in Yosemite National Park where they mingle with giant sequoias.

'Compacta' – A reasonably well known selection that develops into a compact, upright shrub. The needles are powder blue and shorter than the straight species. Plants grow 2-3" a year reaching 3' tall in 10 years. - 2 gal \$45

Abies koreana – Korean Fir – Z3

An outstanding small stature fir that is suitable for most any garden. The beautiful, soft textured foliage creates a striking contrast with its dark green surface and ghostly-white backing. Added interest is provided by beautiful, violet-purple cones which begin to appear when plants are as short as 5' tall. Plants are slow growing and are likely to mature 20-30' in height.

'Aurea' – A superb form with eye-catching gold-topped needles that contrast brilliantly with the bright purple cones. Plants form a well manicured upright habit and brighten the garden all year. - 2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)

'Cis' – A tight, mounding form with deep green needles backed with ghostly white stomatal bands. Quite a bit smaller and more mounding than 'Prostrate Beauty'. Excellent when grouped with other conifers and rock garden plants. 1' high by 3' wide. - 2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69

NEW 'Green Carpet' – A superb low, spreading selection developing a dense, mounded, mat-like form in time. Plants are slow growers with handsome two-toned green and silver needles. An excellent option for the rock garden or border edge. 1' tall x 3' wide over a 10 year period. - 3 gal \$69

NEW 'Kristall Kugel' – A choice miniature selection sporting tightly spaced medium green needles backed with bright white undersides. Prominent waxy-white buds provide added ornamental flair. Plants are slightly faster growing than 'Silberkugel' and 'Silberperle' reaching perhaps 15" high and wide over a 10 year period. - 2 gal \$69 (summer)

'Prostrate Beauty' – A compact, spreading selection introduced by the Arnold Arboretum. Matures 3' high and up to 6' wide in 30 years. Has been around for years but is still one of our favorite low growing firs! - 2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59; Assorted B+B plants individually priced

NEW 'Silberkugel' – Another miniature Korean fir. Plants sport blue-green needles that curve toward the apex of the short stubby branches to showcase the glaucous undersides. The low growing plants average about 1" of growth annually forming 12" wide domes over a 10 year period. Choice, rare and a must for the serious collector. - 2 gal \$69 (summer)

'Silberlocke' – A striking form with needles that roll back around the branches revealing the white undersides. Plants develop

into conical trees. – 2 gal \$45 (summer); 3 gal \$69

NEW 'Silberperle' – Yet another tight little treasure for the rockery. In youth 'Silberperle' maintains a dense mounded form that slowly transitions into an irregular pyramidal habit at maturity. The deep green needles are closely spaced along the branches with prominent white buds decorating the twig ends like miniature Christmas ornaments. A choice and rare plant reaching 2' tall and 1' wide over many years. - 3 gal \$129

NEW 'Starker's Dwarf' – Imagine that, another dwarf cultivar of Korean Fir! This fine form develops an irregular, horizontally branched form somewhat reminiscent of the bird's nest spruce (*Picea abies* 'Nidiformis'). Like many in the group the needles are deep green with a prominent glaucous reverse. Magical violet-blue cones are produced from a young age providing added decoration. Growth rate is similar to 'Prostrate Beauty' with plants reaching 5' high and wide when mature. - 2 gal \$45 (summer)

Abies nordmanniana – Nordmann Fir – Z4
A stately, large growing species native to Turkey and adjacent countries where it is found in pure stands or mixed forests with the likes of *Picea orientalis*, *Pinus sylvestris*, *Fagus orientalis*, and *Acer pseudoplatanus*. The upright-conical trees are cloaked with beautiful greenish-black, soft textured needles along sweeping branches. Matures 40-60' under cultivation and as much as 200' in the wild.

'Pendula' – A slow-growing selection with pendulous branches and an irregular growth form that can be trained and sculpted as the mind desires. – 2 gal \$45; 5 gal \$129

Abies pinsapo – Spanish Fir – Z6
A conical, specimen conifer native to southern Spain where it frequents warm, dry sites. The straight species can grow as much as 100' tall with thick, rigid needles that arrange themselves in whorls around the red-brown stems. Foliage color ranges from powder-blue to forest green. Plants have been hardier than we expected, flourishing in Zone 6 conditions.

NEW 'Aurea' – A distinct selection forming a broad-pyramidal form with unique gold and blue two-toned needles. Like the species the blunt needles radiate around the stems giving the plants a unique and eye-catching appearance. Plants are moderate growers averaging 4-6" of

growth each season. 20' - 3 gal \$89; 5 gal \$139 (summer)

Abies procera 'Glauca Prostrata' – Prostrate Noble Fir – Z5 - A slow growing selection of noble fir that apparently originated as a grafted side branch of the cultivar 'Glauca'. Plants are densely branched and offer handsome, steely-blue needles. Older specimens occasionally produce leaders which should be removed to maintain form. – 3 gal \$89

Cedrus deodara – Himalayan Cedar – Z6
A majestic tree that will develop into a fine specimen in time. Plants are moderate growers reaching 60-70' in cultivation and even more massive proportions in the wild. Fresh green foliage cloaks the branches throughout the year and plants develop a broad pyramidal habit. Numerous outstanding selections have been made for both foliage and growth form. Unfortunately, many are not reliably hardy in our location.

'Karl Fuchs' – A cold-hardy Himalayan cedar with excellent, bluish-silver needles and distinct arching branch tips. Introduced around 1979. – 7 gal \$99

'Shalimar' – A notable introduction from the Arnold Arboretum with excellent cold hardiness and attractive, blue-green foliage. Plants are suited to any well-drained location in full sun. 75' – 7 gal \$99

Cephalotaxus harringtonia – Japanese Plum Yew – Z6
A highly desirable, shrubby conifer native to the Himalayas and eastern Asia that gives the appearance of a yew on steroids. Even better, unlike the true yews, *Cephalotaxus* is deer resistant and has excellent deep green foliage held along a handsome framework. Female plants produce curious, grape-sized fruits that mature over two seasons. Plants are slow growing performing best in partial shade in deep, rich soils. That said, they are quite adaptable to full sun and other soil types. The books say that they're zone 6 hardy but we feel that many clones are worth trialing further north.

'Duke Garden' – A low, spreading shrub developing into a shapely mound of dark green, polished foliage. Plants mature 3' tall and up to 8' feet in width, providing limitless landscape utility. - 2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)

'Fastigiata' – An erect, medium-sized shrub closely resembling a columnar yew in form. Plants are easily integrated into the garden

providing valuable vertical accent. – **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

‘Korean Gold’ – A choice form of plum yew showcasing hot yellow foliage on a columnar framework. On occasion the tips of the branches are so gold that they appear white. Certainly a unique selection and valuable for vertical accent in the garden. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69**

Chamaecyparis lawsoniana – Lawson’s False Cypress – Z5

A western US native forming a large tree as much as 200’ in height. The fine textured foliage is generally greenish-blue in color with faint white markings on the back. The plant is ornamentally significant and numerous cultivars have been selected over the years for varied form, foliage color and vigor. In addition the wood is valued for its durability and straight grain. The species has historically been plagued by various root diseases. Fortunately, many of the cultivars are now grafted on disease resistant rootstocks.

NEW **‘Pembury Blue’** - This fine upright specimen sports amazing powder-blue foliage that provides a true visual treat throughout the year. The foliage literally screams for attention providing an exhaustingly beautiful display. Plants perform best in sunny exposures where they will form dense 10’ specimens over a 15 year period. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

Chamaecyparis nootkatensis – Alaska Cedar – Z5

A moderate-sized cedar native to western North America where it occurs in mixed conifer forests in regions that experience massive amounts of annual snow fall. Develops into a conical specimen tree with an upright central leader and horizontal to slightly drooping, secondary and tertiary branches. The drooping branches have evolved to allow snow to shed more easily, limiting breakage from excess snow loading. The species was recently reclassified under the genus *Xanthocyparis*.

‘Glauca Pendula’ – A fine-textured weeping Alaska cedar with glaucous, bluish foliage. Plants make nice specimens and are attractive all year. – **5 gal \$89; 7 gal \$129 (summer)**

‘Green Arrow’ – Yet another extremely narrow form of weeping Alaska cedar sure to make an impressive vertical statement in any garden. We can’t get enough of these living exclamation points! Plants are relatively fast growing reaching 10’ tall and 2’ wide over 10

years and will ultimately reach 35’ tall with a spread of 4’. Choice and spectacular! - **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer)**

‘Pendula’ – A graceful cultivar that has gained much popularity in recent years. The upright plants have sweeping secondary branches each with strongly pendulous branchlets. Makes a dramatic specimen plant. – **5 gal \$89; 7 gal \$129; Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

‘Van den Akker’ - An extremely narrow selection that develops an upright central leader with all laterals arching straight down. Reported to be the narrowest Alaska cedar available. Not for the faint of heart as a mature specimen can be 20’ tall and only 1-2’ wide. – **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer); 5 gal \$99; Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

Chamaecyparis obtusa – Hinoki Cypress – Z5
A highly variable tree or shrub with soft, dark green foliage and peeling reddish-brown bark. The true species is rarely cultivated and of little significance to the nursery trade. Fortunately (or unfortunately) a startling number of cultivars are available. Most can be utilized as a specimen, companion plant, or addition to the rock garden. Plants perform best in moist, well-drained soil in full sun. Many selections are also surprisingly adaptable to partial shade.

‘Baldwin’s Variegated’ – A compact, variegated form of Hinoki cypress with dark green needles that are heavily splashed with cream and white. Plants develop a narrow, oval form in time and average 2” of growth annually. - **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer)**

‘Blue Feathers’ – A juvenile form of Hinoki cypress with soft-textured, blue-green foliage on an upright-pyramidal framework. Occasionally listed as ‘Ivan’s Column’. - **5 gal \$89; 7 gal \$129**

‘Crippsii’ – A vigorous, bright gold-yellow form that holds its color well all year. Develops into a broad-pyramidal plant that colors best in full sun. One of the best gold cultivars available. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

‘Fernspray Gold’ – The all gold form of ‘Filicoides’ strutting unique fern-like foliage sure to stand out in sun drenched gardens. Plants assume a broad, conical habit growing slightly slower and remaining a touch more compact than ‘Filicoides’. – **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer)**

‘Filicoides’ – A vigorous, upright growing selection with dark green, fern-like foliage. This unique appearance is excellent for

added texture in the winter garden. Plants are moderate growers and will become 20' tall in time. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

'Golden Sprite' – A charming meatball of a hinoki cypress forming a tight, rounded, bun-shaped plant. The slender foliage is bright golden-yellow in full sun. Maturing 2' high and wide in many years. – **1 gal \$35; 2 gal \$49 (summer)**

'Gracilis' – A cultivar that resembles the straight species but grows slower and remains somewhat more compact. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

'Graciosa' – A sport of 'Nana Gracilis' offering handsome, lacy-textured foliage. Plants have a broad-rounded form reaching 8' x 8'. Great for textural contrast. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

NEW 'Kamarachiba' – A semi-dwarf, broad spreading selection that's hard to beat for foliage color and texture. Each finely branched stem is decorated with lacy, pale green and gold foliage that integrates effortlessly into the garden and remains attractive year round. Plants are slow growing reaching 2' high and 3' wide in 10 years. – **2 gal \$39 (summer)**

'Mariesii' – A semi-dwarf form with lush green foliage boldly flecked and splashed with creamy-white. Plants are slow growing, dense and certain to attract much attention. 2-3' tall in 10 years. – **2 gal \$39 (summer); 3 gal \$59; 5 gal \$99**

'Nana' – An outstanding dwarf rounded shrub that grows about 1" a year. Plants have dark green foliage and are perfectly suited for the rock garden. This is the true form that is rarely offered! – **1 gal \$35**

'Pygmaea Aurescens' – A favorite broad spreading hinoki most valued for its bronze-green foliage in the spring and summer garden and rich amber coloration in late fall into winter. An excellent specimen for foundation plantings or for use at the front of a border planting. – **3 gal \$59; 5 gal \$79 (summer)**

'Saffron Spray' – A unique sport of 'Chabo Yadori' with feathery, green juvenile foliage that contrasts brilliantly with the golden-yellow, splashed and streaked adult foliage. Great for year round color. – **2 gal \$39; 5 gal \$79 (summer)**

NEW 'Split Rock' – Widely touted as the bluest selection of *Chamaecyparis obtusa* available! This compact, upright grower makes an excellent contrast element with its soft textured, blue cast juvenile foliage. Plants are

moderate growers averaging 6-8" a year and reaching 12-15' tall at maturity. – **2 gal \$39**

'Tetragona Aurea' – A moderately fast growing conifer developing a narrow, conical framework of glowing golden-yellow foliage. Interesting textural quality is created by the upturned branches that resemble fern fronds. Similar appearance to 'Fernspray Gold' but an overall faster grower. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

'Tsatsumi' – A cool form with dark green foliage that is twisted, contorted and congested in a haphazard fashion. Plants grow 4-5" annually obtaining a 5', irregularly sculpted form over a 10 year period. – **2 gal \$39**

'Verdoni' – An older semi-dwarf, conical hinoki with rounded sprays of golden-yellow foliage that take on orange tones in winter. Plants do not burn in full sun like many of the other golden selections. An excellent, easy to cultivate form for general garden use. – **3 gal \$59; 5 gal \$89 (summer)**

'Wells Special' – A fast-growing upright large shrub or small tree with bright green foliage. Always a popular garden plant. 25' – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

Chamaecyparis pisifera – Sawara False Cypress – Z3

A narrow-pyramidal tree with a somewhat open branch structure. Displays light green foliage and excellent reddish-brown bark that peels off in long strips. Plants are at their best in well-drained soils in a full sun exposure. That said, many of the green and blue forms are happy in high canopy shade as well. The species is native to Japan where the rot resistant wood is used in the construction of palaces, temples and shrines.

'Boulevard' – A popular cultivar with soft-textured, silver-blue foliage on a full, upright, pyramidal plant. Our mature 20' specimen always commands attention. – **2 gal \$39; 5 gal \$89 (summer)**

'Gold Spangles' – A bright golden form of Sawara false cypress which originated in New Zealand. Although first described as a dwarf, mounding form, time has shown them to develop into small upright trees. The gold foliage has a lacy texture and showcases its best coloration in full sun. – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

'Iceberg' – A sport of 'Snow' forming a compact rounded globe of juvenile, whitish-blue foliage. Discovered by Cedar Lodge Nursery in 1991. – **2 gal \$39**

'Mops' – A landscaper's and gardener's favorite. These colorful dwarfs lend their golden, fine-textured greenery to landscapes and gardens throughout the world. Valued for color and contrast they're easily integrated into any sunny, well-drained location. 2-3' in 10 years. - **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$49**

'Vintage Gold' – A vigorous, fern-leaf form with golden-yellow foliage that holds well throughout the summer months. Develops into an 18-30" mounded shrub. – **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$49; Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

Chamaecyparis thyoides – Atlantic White Cedar – Z4

Atlantic white cedar is a large evergreen tree native to the eastern seaboard. Plants have bluish-green foliage and a distinct upright growth habit. They grow best on moist-sandy soils but are adaptable to drier sites. 50-70'

'Shiva' – A fat, pyramidal form with attractive, soft, blue-green foliage. Plants develop a central leader and mature into plump, 8-10' soft-textured figures over 15-20 years. – **5 gal \$69; Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

Cryptomeria japonica – Japanese Cedar – Z6
A graceful, upright-pyramidal tree with bright green summer foliage that takes on a bronze-red hue in winter. Plants are quite unique in appearance among conifers and work well as a specimen or for screening and hedging. Best growth occurs in moist, well-drained soils in a full sun location that is protected from drying winter winds. 50'

'Black Dragon' – An intriguing, upright, compact selection with dark, green-black foliage and a unique, irregular habit. Prolific clusters of small, male cones provide added interest. 12' – **3 gal \$59; 5 gal \$99 (summer)**

'Hino' – A perfectly round ball of tidy, densely spaced, awl-shaped foliage. Fresh green color is maintained throughout the growing season, taking on bronze overtones in cooler weather. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

'Sekkan' – A shocking, sulfur-yellow conifer that quickly forms an upright-pyramidal tree. Forms a great specimen plant and is excellent when used for contrast. 30' – **3 gal \$59; 5 gal \$99 (summer)**

'Spiraliter Falcata' – A dwarf, upright Japanese cedar with light green foliage and branches that twist and contort in a haphazard manner. Makes a unique specimen or unusual

conversation piece. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

'Yoshino' – A vigorous form with rich green summer foliage that becomes bronze-green in winter. Plants are care-free and easy to grow. Probably one of the best cultivars available for general garden use and excellent cold hardiness for the species. 30-40' – **3 gal \$45; 5 gal \$69 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

Cupressus glabra **'Blue Ice'** – Arizona Cypress – Z6

An attractive evergreen tree developing a handsome, upright, pyramidal habit with age. Foliage is striking pewter-blue, providing unique textural interest year round. Certainly a plant of considerable beauty and a worthy choice for the garden. A 4-5' specimen we put in the ground a couple of seasons back has performed better than expected with little foliage discoloration despite an especially rugged test last winter. Looks like it might be more cold hardy than anticipated and could be worth a shot in a protected zone 5 spot. 20' – **7 gal \$99**

Juniperus chinensis – Chinese Juniper – Z3

A highly variable evergreen shrub or tree with sharp, blue-green foliage and numerous landscape applications. Plants are tough, requiring full sun and thriving in any well-drained garden soil. The straight species is rarely grown but is represented in cultivation by several exceptional forms.

'Daub's Frosted' – An attractive, spreading conifer with light yellow new growth that contrasts brilliantly against the fine textured, blue-green older growth. Makes a striking combination in a well-drained, sun-bathed location. Has been a hit since we offered it often selling out during the first month of the sales season! – **2 gal \$35 (summer); 3 gal \$49**

'Mac's Golden' – A dense, pyramidal juniper with soft yellow needles. Plants are moderate growers reaching 10' tall at maturity. - **5 gal \$69; 7 gal \$89 (summer)**

'Obelisk' – A narrow, pyramidal cultivar with sharp, gray-green juvenile needles. Excellent for screening, hedging or textural contrast. 8-10' – **5 gal \$69; 7 gal \$89 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

Juniperus communis – Common Juniper – Z2

Common juniper is a highly variable species with an incredibly wide native distribution including Europe, the Mediterranean, Asia Minor and North America. This extensive range has led

to many cultivar selections of all shapes and sizes. Most are quite easy to grow and perform best in well-drained soils in full sun. Plants will not tolerate wet feet.

‘Gold Cone’ – A vibrant “wow” plant with a tight-upright habit and striking gold-flushed needles. A mature plant will be 10’ tall and only 18” wide. Brilliant! – **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer)**

‘Miniature’ – A form that is quite similar to ‘Compressa’ but develops a slightly chubbier form. Who knows, we love dwarf upright junipers so figured we couldn’t go wrong with this one. - **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59**

‘Oblonga Pendula’ – A stylish, weeping juniper that parades irregularly arching stems that sweep and curve in every direction. Each twig is dressed with elongated, olive-silver needles that add much grace and interest to the free-form branch architecture. An excellent specimen for challenging, free draining sites in full sun. - **5 gal \$99; 7 gal \$129 (summer)**

‘Tage Lundell’ – Appears to be just another slow-growing upright juniper but closer examination reveals dramatic yellow tipped and splashed foliage. Found in Sweden and introduced by Horstmann Nursery in Germany. 7’ - **5 gal \$89; 7 gal \$109 (summer)**

Juniperus horizontalis – Creeping Juniper - Z4
A native low, spreading groundcover that frequents sun drenched sparse soils throughout much of northern North America. The thin, needled foliage is medium green during the growing season picking up plum and purple hues in cool weather. The species and its numerous cultivars are much valued for their low growth form and landscape versatility. Easy to grow in full sun exposures with adequate drainage.

NEW **‘Monber’ Icee Blue® PP 9639** – A recent selection reported to showcase the best silver-blue needle color of all the prostrate junipers. Plants are versatile, maintaining a low growth form and dense foliage cover. Should become a landscaper’s dream! – **3 gal \$39**

‘Mother Lode’ PP 5948 – A startling, golden-yellow, ground hugging juniper that comes to us from the conifer addicts of Iseli Nursery. Valued for use as a groundcover where its horizontal framework blends attractively with stonework and other hardscape elements. It’s also pretty darn good for keeping those unsightly weeds at bay. - **2 gal \$35**

Juniperus procumbens **‘Nana’** – Dwarf Japanese Juniper – Z3

One of the most common groundcover junipers developing a 2’ tall by 10’ wide, irregular mounded form of medium green needles. Useful for adding structure and cohesiveness to the garden or for creating a graceful oriental flair. - **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$49 (summer)**

Juniperus squamata – Flaky Juniper – Z4

A widely distributed juniper species with a native range that extends throughout southwestern China and the wilds of Afghanistan. Plants are irregular in form assuming both shrubby and tree-like forms. Its namesake is derived from the brownish bark that flakes off in thin sheets. This feature is complemented by blue-green, needle-like foliage and glossy, rounded, blue-black, fleshy cones. The species itself is rarely cultivated but is represented by several superior cultivars.

‘Blue Star’ - A widely used plant aptly named for its attractive, powder blue, star-like juvenile foliage. Plants develop into shapely mounds and are easily integrated into many full sun, well-drained situations. - **2 gal \$35**

‘Holger’ – A broad, spreading form of flaky juniper with a loose, low habit. In spring, foliage flushes creamy-yellow and slowly matures through shades of white, before it finally settles on bright, blue-green. - **2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$49**

Juniperus virginiana – Eastern Red Cedar – Z4

A durable and super hardy native tree frequently encountered in abandoned fields and along roadsides in states east of the Rocky Mountains. The upright, pyramidal plants make a great choice for screening, hedges or windbreaks in full sun, well-drained locations. 'Mini Mini' – Mini mini is right! This cutie slowly develops into a bun-shaped globe of tiny green needles and rich brown buds. Originated from a witches' broom that was found on a plant of *P. mugo* 'Valley Cushion'. Will no doubt be quite popular among plant nuts who seek out these tiny treasures! This little guy will reach a whopping 8" tall and 10" wide in 10 years! – **2 gal \$55 (summer)**

NEW **'Sunshine'** – A compact mugo pine sporting medium green needles highlighted with a prominent yellow splash much in the manner of the dragon eye pines. The dwarf plants are good performers resisting sunburn and providing excellent structure and garden durability. 3' - **2 gal \$45 (summer)**

NEW **'Valley Cushion'** – A tightly branched spreading pine reaching 2-3' wide over a 10 year period. The dwarf plants sport olive green needles and are excellent for general garden use. Selected and introduced by Oregon State University in the 1970's. - **2 gal \$35 (summer)**

Pinus parviflora – Japanese White Pine – Z5

A highly variable pine native to many regions of Japan. The soft needles are bluish-green and clustered in groups of five. Bark is generally smooth and gray-green in color. Plants assume a flat-topped artistic habit and make fine specimens.

'AOI' – A compact, narrow pine developing an upright form with age. Needles are short, thick and have an excellent blue-green color. Popular in Japan. – **2 gal \$45; 5 gal \$99**

'Azuma' – A compact cultivar with lovely blue cast foliage. Plants grow 6" a year once established. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

'Cleary' – A rare, semi-compact selection with long, powder blue needles that gently twist and curve to reveal their silver-blue backing. Plants are moderate growers developing a dense, upright, cone-shaped habit in time. Worthy of much wider garden consideration. - **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer)**

NEW **'Diassetsu San'** – A choice dwarf clone slowly developing a squat, pyramidal habit. Foliage is glaucous blue-green and attractive year round. NEW **'Eiko Nishiki'** – An upright, semi-dwarf pine sporting petite, jade-blue needles. Great for bonsai, the rock garden or for an area where horizontal branch space is limited. - **2 gal \$45**

'Glauca Brevifolia' – A form with short, up-curved needles that have a rich blue-green color. Habit and form are like the species. – **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer)**

'Goldilocks' – A distinct slow growing selection with rich yellow needles all year long. Plants easily grab attention and are worthy of a prime location in the garden. – **3 gal \$99; 5 gal \$169 (summer)**

'Hagoromo' – A miniature Japanese white pine forming a tight rounded bun of ½" blue-green needles. Plants are slow to develop but offer great potential for bonsai or trough gardens. – **2 gal \$55; 3 gal \$99**

'Ogon' – A semi-dwarf, irregular evergreen cloaked with soft-textured needles

colored in a range of creamy-yellow tones. When grown properly they are capable of illuminating the garden with the most magical glow! What a great plant to shed some light during those winter months. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

NEW 'Ogon Janome' – An irregular-spreading Japanese white pine donning sleek green needles each boldly highlighted with a prominent bright yellow band. Certainly among the more brilliant of the pines and deserving of wider use in areas where dazzling year round color is desired. Optimum growth occurs in drought free soils in areas that offer some shelter from hot, direct sun. - **2 gal \$45 (summer); 6 gal \$249**

'Pygmea' – A slow growing, unassuming selection with cute, half-sized leaves colored in shades of blue, silver and green. Pinus pumila – Japanese Stone Pine – Z3
A shrubby, irregular species that can be found in its native habitat throughout much of Asia and eastern Siberia. Plants are slow growers reaching perhaps 15-18' in height and spread under normal garden conditions. The blue-toned needles are held in groups of five and are somewhat reminiscent of our native eastern white pine. Plants are rare but are worth seeking out for the sculpted look and oriental feel they add to the garden.

'Dwarf Blue' – A compact, spreading Japanese stone pine with brilliant blue cast foliage. Plants grow 4-6" a year and develop a flat, table-top like look with maturity. - **2 gal \$45**

Pinus strobus – Eastern White Pine – Z3

An easy going native of the eastern United States valued for use in large landscapes. The handsome soft needles are blue-green in color and arranged in groups of five. Plants are easy to grow and display good vigor in full sun, well-drained locations. 50-80' - **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

NEW 'Angel Falls' – A choice weeping selection of eastern white pine destined to become quite popular. Plants offer an abundance of fine textured greenery and a narrow, refined growth habit of strongly pendulous branches. Some staking is required for vertical gain with trained plants reaching 6-8' tall over 10 years. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69; 5 gal \$99 (summer)**

'Aureovariegata' – An uncommon selection with finely textured foliage that is marked with an unusual yellow striping pattern. NEW 'Beth WB' – A low mounded form discovered by our friend Jay Angle from a witches' broom found growing in Bethany, Connecticut. Plants have good blue cast needle color and maintain a tight growth form. Ultimate dimensions are still unclear for this new and choice selection - **2 gal \$45**

NEW 'Diggy' – A slow-growing, upright white pine dressed with short, thin tufted needles. 'Diggy' is quite distinct among the dwarf white pine cultivars and would make a great plant for the rock garden or other sunny location. - **2 gal \$45 (summer)**

'Hillside Winter Gold' – A vigorous, upright-pyramidal cultivar with golden yellow leaves in the cool weather of winter. Plants have pale green foliage during the rest of the year. - **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59; 5 gal \$89; 7 gal \$129**

NEW 'Kruger's Liliput' – A dense, globe-shaped selection sporting half sized silvery-green needles. Averages 2" of growth annually reaching 2' x 2' over 10 years. - **2 gal \$45**

'Little Giant' – A Broken Arrow Nursery introduction that has received many favorable comments. This plant resulted from a witches' broom found growing in Sleeping Giant State Park, Hamden, CT. 'Louie' – A dramatic selection with bright yellow, finely textured foliage all year

long. Plants flourish in the landscape achieving best needle coloration in full sun exposures. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

'Mini Twists' – A slow growing dwarf white pine with twisted and contorted needles. Discovered as a chance seedling by famed conifer guru Greg Williams in his northern Vermont nursery. 'Soft Touch' – A 1985 introduction selected and named by Dr. Sid Waxman. Develops a dense, broad habit with short, medium green needles that are especially soft to the touch. A versatile slow-growing landscape plant that was awarded a 2004 Cary Award for being an outstanding plant for New England landscapes. 2-3' - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

NEW **'Sonya'** – One of Dr. Sid Waxman's last plant introductions. Plants are among the slowest growing of the white pine cultivars we offer. Our 15 year old landscape specimen is approximately 1' tall with a 2' spread and averages only around 1" of growth annually. Plants have reduced foliage size and medium green needle coloration. NEW **'Tiny Kurls'** – An irresistibly cute selection boasting dense branching and blue cast, frilly, twisted needles. The dwarf plants develop

'Torulosa' – A large form with blue-green, twisted and curled needles. Plants develop like the species but add distinct texture to the garden. - **2 gal \$39; 5 gal \$89 (summer)**

Pinus sylvestris – Scotch Pine – Z2

An irregular species native throughout much of Europe and Asia. When mature, plants develop a sculpted, open habit with fine, orange-brown bark. A choice conifer noted for its irregular sculpted habit and dense, tufted dark green needles set off by prominent silver-white dormant buds. In their native haunts plants are often seen growing on flat sandy beaches and on rocky cliffs where they tolerate some of the worst conditions Mother Nature can throw at them. In the garden plants tolerate any full sun, well-drained site and show tolerance to salt spray and drought. 30-40'

'Shirome Janome' – A vigorous, upright, irregular formed evergreen certain to please those looking for another plant with gold striping and splotching! Each long slender deep green needle of this fine treasure is brushed with a bright orange-gold band giving the plants a startling impression when viewed from a distance. Kind of like the valedictorian when it comes to year round color in the garden. - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced.**

'Thunderhead' – This spectacular pine is one of the finest conifers for general use. The compact plants are slower growing than the species and showcase long, heavy textured, forest-green needles. In spring, distinctive white candles provide a remarkable contrast with the dark green surroundings. Prominent snow-white buds are present throughout the rest of the year. 'Foxy Fir' – A dense, rounded cultivar with medium green needles. Makes a unique rounded shrub for the conifer garden. Will grow 1-2" a year. - **2 gal \$45**

Sciadopitys verticillata – Japanese Umbrella Pine – Z5
A remarkable conifer native to a restricted region in Japan. The dark green needles have a thick, rubbery texture and are arranged in whorls along the branches. Plants are slow growing and perform best in acidic soils in full sun or high canopy shade. Matures up to 60' tall over several generations! 'Cynthia Waxman' – Among Dr. Waxman's last selections and perhaps one of his finest. 'Cynthia Waxman' forms a dense, symmetrical, cone-shaped tree with dark green

foliage. Matures smaller and more refined than the species and is worthy of a prominent spot in the garden. - 2 gal \$69

'Jim Cross' – A slow-growing form that bears the name of an outstanding, departed Long Island plantsman. This attractive selection ultimately forms a dense, rounded form up to 10' tall after many years. - 2 gal \$59; 3 gal \$89 (summer)

'Joe Kozy' – An upright, near columnar form, selected and introduced by the late plantsman extraordinaire, Dr. Sid Waxman. Plants are moderate growers with dark green needles that hold their color in winter. - 2 gal \$59

NEW **'Mitsch Select'** – A choice slow growing Japanese umbrella pine forming an attractive shrub-like habit. Plants develop a defined leader when young but broaden with age. The squat needles are rich forest-green and are held tightly along the dense branches. - 2 gal \$69; 3 gal \$99

NEW **'Picola'** – The smallest of the umbrella pines that we currently offer. 'Picola' showcases fresh green needles held along upright, brown-tan stems. Certainly a dramatic departure from the species yet an indispensable addition to the rockery. - 2 gal \$69 (summer)

In autumn, the foliage turns rich orange-brown and provides a wonderful complement to the reddish-brown bark. Plants develop into majestic specimens

and are adaptable to both wet and dry. In wet areas the roots will develop unique "cypress knees". 80' – Assorted B+B plants individually priced

NEW **'Crazy Horse'** – A very rare and unusual bald cypress with branches that twist and contort in an irregular fashion as the plant gains height. Foliage is rich green during the growing season and is contorted and clustered along the stems appearing more like a juvenile cedar than a bald cypress. 'Falling Waters' – A new selection named and introduced by Don Shadow. Plants are reported to develop a prominent upright leader with all secondary branches drooping strongly against the main trunk. We haven't seen a picture yet but can imagine a fantastic form. - 2 gal \$39 (summer)

'Peve Minaret' – A distinct new Dutch selection that slowly develops into an attractive, upright-pyramidal form. Plants are completely different than the classic bald cypress and may prove to be one of the finest new conifers to emerge on the market in recent years. The compact plants have sturdy, dense branches cloaked with fine-textured, fresh green foliage throughout the season. Bright, bronze-gold fall color and sculpted winter branch texture provide added seasonal appeal. 'Peve Yellow' – Yet another exciting Dutch bald cypress. 'Peve Yellow' offers a compact habit and glowing, sun tolerant, yellow-hued foliage in spring and summer followed by glowing golden-brown fall color. Unique and different by its own merit. - 2 gal \$39; 5 gal \$89; 7 gal \$129 (summer)

NEW **'Schloss Herten'** – Among the smallest of the dwarf bald cypress selections that we grow. The tightly branched treasures make 2' rounded forms over many years. Choice, rare and a shapely addition to the rock garden. - 2 gal \$45

Taxus baccata – European Yew – Z5
A medium sized evergreen tree native to much of Europe, northern Africa, Iran and parts of

southwestern Asia. The dark green, needled foliage is broad and aligned in two rows along pale green twigs. Bark on mature plants peels and flakes off freely and is a stunning reddish-brown color. Unfortunately, this character is generally not appreciated as most insist on shaping the plants into formal, manicured domes, boxes or hedges. Although suitable for this use we encourage you to resist this temptation and grow the plants less formally as specimen trees. Ancient, awe inspiring specimens can be found growing in this manner throughout much of Europe.

NEW 'Amersfoort' – An irregular selection with curious, half sized, dark green needles that add a heavy texture to the garden. Quite a bit different than the straight species yet distinctive, handsome and easy to grow. - 2 gal \$39 (summer)

Thuja occidentalis – White Cedar or Eastern Arborvitae – Z3

A native of eastern North America from Manitoba to North Carolina where it inhabits bogs and wetlands. Plants are hardy and adaptable and display amazing natural variation. In the landscape, plants are frequently used for hedging. Best performance occurs in deep, well-drained soils in full sun. Matures 40-50' tall with a 10-20' spread.

NEW 'Degroot's Spire' – A slow growing, decidedly upright clone growing 6' tall and only 1' wide over a 10 year period. Much valued for vertical accent and heavily utilized for hedging and general landscape applications – 2 gal \$35 (summer); Assorted B+B plants individually priced

'Gold Cargo' – A showy cultivar of white cedar with bright gold foliage that is resistant to wind burn and remains prominent in the garden throughout the year. Plants are upright and vigorous growers reaching 25' tall and 6-8' wide when mature. - 2 gal \$35

'Linesville' – A dwarf, mounded arborvitae forming a perfectly rounded ball, 3' high and wide. The juvenile foliage is elongated, stringy and soft green in color. Makes a great landscape plant or container subject. – 2 gal \$35; 3 gal \$49

'Spiralis' - A slender selection forming a narrow upright growth form. The fern-like branches align themselves in a short, slightly twisted manner that lends a unique character to the plants. Moderately fast growers, plants will approach 15' when mature. – Assorted B+B plants individually priced

NEW 'Sudworthii' – A vigorous, upright pyramidal form that brightens the garden with foliage that is bright gold during the growing season and picks up considerable orange-gold tones during the winter months. Always attractive and quite easy to grow. - Assorted B+B plants individually priced

'Wansdyke Silver' - A slow growing, upright form with creamy-white variegated foliage. Plants are eye-catching throughout the season adding excellent color and texture to the garden. - Assorted B+B plants individually priced

Thuja orientalis - Oriental Arborvitae – Z5

A large shrub or small tree forming a dense, upright framework of vertically arranged branches. Foliage is medium green and lends a fine texture to the garden. Plants are adaptable to many soils including those with high pH and poor moisture retention.

NEW 'Franky Boy' – Not just cool but extra cool! 'Franky Boy' is a wonderful textural treat sure to cause a stir with its bright gold, thread like growth that looks like the hair from an 80's punk rock band. If this isn't enough, in winter, the rounded shrub-like plants pick up rich orange-bronze tones providing added seasonal appeal. 5' - 3 gal \$59

'Morgan' – A dazzling little *Thuja* forming a handsome, well behaved oval framework of vertically aligned branches. In summer the leaf coloration is an average pale green but the plants come alive in winter when they take on intense bronze-orange tones. Thuja plicata – Western Arborvitae – Z5

A handsome, large-growing pyramidal evergreen native to western North America. The species is valued for timber and was used historically by Native Americans for totem poles and canoes. In the landscape, plants add excellent structure with

NEW **'Whip Cord'** – A unique dwarf rounded selection that draws attention with its rich green foliage that's held in unique lacy, whip-like branchlets. Difficult to describe yet outstanding for texture and structure. Plants are slow growing, forming 3-4' irregular mounds with arching and cascading stems. – **3 gal \$49**

'Zebrina' – A vigorous form that develops a broad-conical habit in time. Each spray of foliage is irregularly marked with yellow variegation that adds a touch of color to an otherwise green background. 40' – **Assorted B+B plants individually priced**

'Zebrina Extra Gold' – A new cultivar developing into a broad-pyramidal specimen with feathery foliage that is generously highlighted with orange and yellow streaking. Plants have proven vigorous and have been outstanding for texture and form. – **7 gal \$99;**

Thujaopsis dolobrata – Staghorn Cedar – Z5
A unique monotypic genus native to southern Japan where it occurs in moist dense forests. The overall appearance is somewhat similar to an arborvitae but is generally slightly coarser in both texture and branch structure. Foliage is medium-green throughout the growing season taking on some bronze and orange hues in cooler weather. Best when grown in evenly moist, well-drained soil in full sun or high canopy shade. 30-50' **'Nana'** – 'Nana' is a carefree, compact selection forming a small rounded shrub with respectable olive-green foliage. Plants are happy in any reasonably well-drained soil in

either full sun or high canopy shade. – **2 gal \$39 (summer)**

'Variegata' – A very rare form showcasing sprays of foliage that are boldly splashed and painted with shades of cream and white. Plants mature roughly half the size of the species forming large pyramidal shrubs in time. Some sheering helps maintain a full form. 15' – **2 gal \$39; 3 gal \$59 (summer)**

Torreya nucifera – Japanese Torreya – Z6
Japanese torreya is a rare evergreen tree maturing 40' in height. Plants offer lustrous dark green foliage and curious, 1" rounded seeds. Makes a unique choice for screening, hedging or as a specimen. An outstanding specimen resides on the grounds of Swarthmore College in Swarthmore, PA. – **2 gal \$45**

Tsuga canadensis – Eastern Hemlock – Z3
A graceful tree native to eastern North America where it thrives in moist, well-drained, acidic soils. These durable plants are suited for many landscape situations and are surprisingly tolerant of shade. Unfortunately, the species is plagued by several insect and disease problems and requires routine maintenance to manage these pests. Despite these downfalls we carry several cultivars as we feel their beauty is well worth the time required to properly care for them.

'Cole's Prostrate' – A graceful, weeping cultivar discovered in the wilds of New Hampshire by H.R. Cole in 1929. The outstanding plants are slow growing with a distinct, prostrate form. Makes an extremely attractive addition to any rockery or tight garden corner. – **2 gal \$39**

NEW **'Everitt Gold'** – A compact selection developing an upright, cone-shaped habit. Much valued for its bright golden foliage that picks up bronze hues in cold weather. An excellent plant for the large rock garden or for use as a specimen. Plants mature 6' tall with a 3' spread. – **2 gal \$45**

'Golden Splendor' – An all gold hemlock developing into a large specimen in time. Foliage coloration is best in full sun and will not burn in these conditions. Plants are tolerant of sheering and make attractive hedges or screens. Introduced by Mitsch Nursery in 1979. – **3 gal \$59; 5 gal \$89 (summer)**

NEW **'Humphrey Welch'** – A charming, dwarf hemlock sure to impress with its delicate, light green needles held on thin, slightly arching stems. Choice and distinct! – **2 gal \$45**

'Jervis' – An adorable, slow growing, densely branched cultivar forming an irregular conical shrub. Plants have dark green needles that are clumped and congested along the branches with prominent brown buds interspersed. Another great plant for the rock garden! - **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

'Moon Frost' – An exciting dwarf hemlock with showy white new growth said to resemble the “glow of frost on a moonlit night”. Plants are reliable growers performing best in part shade. As an added bonus the needles pick up attractive pink tones in winter. – **2 gal \$45 (summer); 6 gal \$129**

'Summer Snow' – A show-stopping, upright conical hemlock with snow-white new growth that creates a remarkable contrast against the dark green interior needles. Well grown specimens appear as if they have just received a fresh coat of snow on their branches. Plants are moderately fast growing and quite shade tolerant. - **2 gal \$45 (summer); 6 gal \$129**

NEW *Tsuga carolina* **'Mountain Mist'** – Mountain Mist Carolina Hemlock – Z4 - A rare weeping hemlock sporting two-toned deep green and silver foliage. Older plants add character with a display of tiny cones that hang like raindrops from the arching branches. Plants are moderate growers developing as a rambling groundcover or small weeping tree if staked. 6' tall x 3' wide in 10 years. – **2 gal \$45; 3 gal \$69 (summer)**

NEW *Tsuga heterophylla* **'Thorsen'** – Thorsen's Weeping Hemlock – Z5 – A choice, weeping clone of western hemlock sporting rich green foliage along lax, strongly arching stems. Plants develop a ground hugging habit when left to their own or can be staked to develop vertical character. Among the finest of the various weeping *Tsuga* selections that have emerged on the market. - **3 gal \$69**

NEW *Tsuga mertensiana* **'Bump's Blue'** – Bump's Blue Mountain Hemlock – Z5 - An exciting new mountain hemlock discovered in the wilds of Oregon's Mt. Hood region. The cone shaped plants stop all onlookers with their incredible powder blue foliage coloration that rivals any hemlock on the market. Plants are moderate growers reaching 5-6' tall over a 10 year period. - **2 gal \$45**
